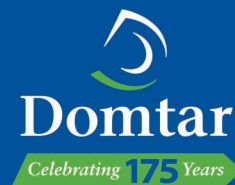

AT A GLANCE

Domtar's Dryden mill has been producing pulp for more than 100 years. With a fiber line currently producing Northern Bleached Softwood Kraft pulp, the facility is nestled in the heart of Northwestern Ontario Canada. The mill is licensed to manage two Sustainable Forest License Areas on behalf of the province of Ontario. These areas, called the Trout Lake and the Wabigoon Forests, combined are nearly of 1.9 million hectares in size (4.4 million acres). The softwood fiber sourced from these license areas, as well as from other adjacent lands, is well-suited to produce high quality pulp for use in the manufacturing of a variety of premium paper towel and tissue products, as well as specialty grade papers.

ENVIRONMENTAL & COMMUNITY INVESTMENT

- The Dryden Mill is self-sufficient in meeting its electricity needs, often generating more than it consumes and providing excess renewable electricity to the grid.
- In 2021 there were 11.8 million trees hand planted by Domtar on the Trout Lake and Wabigoon forests and an additional 7.7 million trees projected in 2022.
- Each year, the Dryden Mill contributes about **\$45,000 (USD)** in grassroots giving to the local community and supports regional Indigenous initiatives.

ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTIONS

The Dryden Mill supports approximately **370** local jobs.
