MILL OVERVIEW

The Clermont Mill as we know it today was built by the brothers Timothy and Charles Donohue around 1929. Domtar has been the sole owner of the Clermont Mill since acquiring the remaining 49% stake held by The New York Times Company in 2018. Today, the Clermont Mill proudly operates a state-of-the-art newsprint machine and integrated pulp line, delivering high-quality products to customers across North America and internationally.



ENVIRONMENTAL CONTRIBUTIONS

- Since 2000, Clermont Mill's direct and indirect (scope 1 and 2) greenhouse gas emissions have been reduced by 96%.
- 100% of the electricity consumed by the mill is produced from renewable sources such as hydroelectricity.
- The mill recently installed water-to-water heat pumps and heat exchangers with the objective of recovering residual heat from mill processes to reduce energy consumption.
- The mill provides finances and technical maintenance to the salmon ladder at the mill's adjacent dam in collaboration with the Rivière MalBaie Salmon Corporation.



COMMUNITY INVESTMENT

- Clermont Mill employees get involved in various causes such as La Guignolée des Médias, the La Malbaie Hospital Foundation, as well as participating in different golf tournaments for charitable purposes. For every 250,000 hours without a recordable injury, employees receive between \$5,000 and \$15,000 that they donate to community organizations.
