MILL OVERVIEW

Domtar's Gatineau Mill has long been a cornerstone of the local community. Domtar's Gatineau Mill has long been a cornerstone of the local community. Canadian International Paper Company began construction at the Gatineau Mill in 1926. In 1933, the surrounding settlement became the village of Gatineau, which was later incorporated as the City of Gatineau in 1946. The mill was acquired by Domtar in 2023 and now employs 140 people. In addition to producing newsprint, it can generate 15 MWh of electricity through cogeneration, which is sold to Hydro-Québec.



ENVIRONMENTAL CONTRIBUTIONS

- 100% of the electricity that the Gatineau Mill consumes is produced from renewable sources, such as hydroelectricity.
- The mill's indirect emissions, including those from purchased electricity, have been reduced by 90% since 2015.
- The replacement of the combustion grate in Domtar's Gatineau mill biomass boiler in 2025 significantly reduced natural gas consumption by 60%, resulting in an annual greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions reduction of more than 20,000 tonnes of CO₂ equivalent per year—the equivalent of removing more than 7,500 cars from the road.



COMMUNITY INVESTMENT

- In the last year, Gatineau Mill has provided around \$20,000 in direct financial contributions to local organizations.
- The mill remains actively involved in local organizations, such as the AGAP, CVQ, and the Chamber of Commerce, and has facilitated a citizen committee since 2024.
