MILL OVERVIEW

In 1909, Price Brothers and Company acquired a 400-acre plot of land in Kénogami for \$135,000 to build a pulp and paper mill and develop it into a company town. In 1912, construction was completed, making Kénogami Mill one of the first pulp and paper mills in Canada. Today, Kénogami Mill continues to produce a wide range of mechanical papers, including high-grade supercalendered papers for commercial printers and publishers.



ENVIRONMENTAL CONTRIBUTIONS

- Kénogami Mill has strengthened its commitment to sustainability by investing 38 million dollars in a project aimed at producing renewable, low-carbon cellulose filaments from wood fibers, while optimizing its paper mill in Quebec to support greener industrial growth.



COMMUNITY INVESTMENT

- The mill donates rolls of paper to the Rives-Du-Saguenay School Board, which are distributed to 23 schools in the region.
- The mill also contributes to various organizations and initiatives, including the Canadian Mental Health Association, A Step for My Mental Health, LEUCAN, Maison de l'Espoir, and the Ariane Foundation.
